COLLEGE PROJECT

After seeking out administration and faculty to find the need on our campus that beckoned the most, our team found it: Developmental Math. We were approached by Melissa Carpenter from the Foundation of Student Success with the grim statistic reported from last semester: fifty-three percent failure rate among first-time MAT 092 students. Our chapter's College Project is called Peer Advocates for Student: Success Math, a peer-based program that connects students in higher level math classes to students in developmental math classes, with the aim to improve retention and success rates within those classes. This summer, the College Project Committee dedicated itself to hours of training on the content of 'Winning at Math' by Dr. Paul Nolting. The textbook gives tactical advice on studying, test-taking, and managing one's time. Last month, we recruited eighteen Peer Advocates-nine at Red Mountain and nine at the Southern and Dobson campus. This month we will hold training sessions for those new to the team and start heading into classes here at Southern and Dobson. We will also begin holding workshops that will be open to all Mesa Community College students on the various techniques we've learned this summer.

On the part of the entire Executive Board, thank you to all the new Phi Theta Kappans who are stepping up. Omicron Beta wouldn't be a chapter without you! Also, a shout out to our team at Red Mountain, whom are already integrating themselves into math classes, and making a difference!
