General Program Description: The **Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree in Recreation Management** is designed to prepare students for entry-level positions in the recreation field and provides the first half of a four-year undergraduate program of study in Recreation Management and/or Leadership. The program focuses on the positive application of play, recreation, and leisure across the life span. Along with required general education courses, the program includes foundational and practical experience in the programming and delivery of recreational services and the development of communication, group facilitation, management, leadership and technical skills. The optional **Certificates of Completion (CCL) in Recreation Management and Group Fitness Instructor** provide a stepping path leading to the AAS degree.

Licensing and Certifications: Depending on their duties, recreation workers may be required to have a license or certificate. For example, those who direct water recreation programs may be required to have a lifesaving certificate. Some recreation workers may need a driver's license.

Advancement options: Beginning recreation workers start by leading activities. Experienced workers who have good people skills may advance to supervising others. Those who are good at organizing may advance to planning and managing recreational activities.

Projected Job Growth: Recreation jobs will continue to increase, especially in services for senior citizens. The population of seniors is expected to grow rapidly. Those who are active are expected to participate in more activities than previous generations of seniors. Those who are in nursing homes will also be exposed to more activities. In contrast, the number of jobs with government-sponsored programs will grow more slowly.
